ANCIENT STONES, LIVING STONES - In May 2016, Prof. Henry Hubert and Rev. Dawne Taylor journeyed to Jordan and Israel as part of a study tour through Canadian Mennonite University. This “Ancient Stones, Living Stones” tour included aspects of ancient and modern history in the area, visits to Biblical places and holy sites, speakers from the Palestinian and Israeli communities, and several nature walks.
