MONTHLY MINISTRY FOCUS – THE CATHEDRAL CENTERING PRAYER MINISTRY

Verna Albright writes: Centering Prayer has been my spiritual practice since 1995. Centering Prayer can be practised in several different ways and each approach can bring joy and riches to the individual praying. It is an opportunity to be with God in silence, contemplative reading, chanting and praying. Here is one method:

1. Choose a sacred word as a symbol of your intention to consent to God's Presence.
2. Sitting comfortably with your eyes gently closed, silently consent to God's presence.
3. When you become aware of anything gently use your sacred word to return to the Lord.

Centering Prayer occurs on Wednesday morning for an hour beginning at 11 am in the Chancel. After a time in silence we look at Holy Scripture using a method of *Lectio Divina*. Please come and join us. For more information contact: Verna Albright valbright@shaw.ca or 250 579 -5208.

Fr. Brokenleg will share research and experience from his lengthy and detailed engagement with indigenous communities who continue to struggle with the effects of inter-generational transfer of trauma. He argues that similar social, psychological and spiritual dynamics will become evident in the lives of refugees from amongst other places, Syria. This experience will present challenges to Canadian faith communities who seek to support these newcomers to Canada.
