National Indigenous Bishop and Reconciliation Animator to visit St. Paul's

Sunday morning, July 8, St. Paul's will welcome two special visitors as preacher and presider at both morning services at 8 and 10 a.m. We also hope Bishop Barbara will be able to join us.

Bishop Mark became the Anglican Church of Canada's first National Indigenous Anglican Bishop in 2007 after serving as bishop of the U.S. Episcopal Diocese of Alaska for 10 years. He is a partner with and advocate for Indigenous Anglicans throughout Canada and globally.





In her present role as reconciliation animator, Melanie Delva is responsible for forming and equipping a national team to “encourage and sustain engagement in the work of reconciliation between Indigenous and non-Indigenous persons and communities, both within the Anglican Church of Canada and in Canadian society.” She is well-known to Anglicans in our Territory through her work with residential school documentation. We are honoured to welcome both these gifted leaders to St. Paul’s.
