



MONTHLY MINISTRY FOCUS – THE CIRCULAR NEWSLETTER

The Circular is now in its thirteenth year of publication, having first appeared in September of 2006. Four issues are published a year: September, December, March and June. The aim is to share news and information about parish life.

Themes help to focus each issue.

Parishioners, clergy and ministry groups submit articles, photos, reports, book reviews and announcements which reflect the Glory of God. Prose, poetry, artwork, photographs, personal testimonies, reports on events within and outside the parish, announcements, even church related jokes are all welcome. We have plenty of hidden talent at St. Paul's. We invite everyone to submit ideas and items for publication. Items can be dropped off at the Cathedral Office or e-mailed to stpaulscathedralcircular@gmail.com.

The Circular had evolved overtime. Initially there was a large editorial board that met several times a year to discuss content for current and future issues, a production staff that met four times to assemble the contributions and a distribution staff to stuff, address and stamp envelopes.

Time and attrition have reduced the board to three, Elizabeth Kavanagh, editor, Dean Ken Gray and Mary Dove, who meet four times a year to discuss content.

Advancements in computers and word processing programs have greatly streamlined production and distribution. The editor alone now assembles all the contributions, then meets two weeks before the issue date with copy editor/proof reader Mary Dove. When they are satisfied all errors and omissions have been corrected the Circular is transmitted electronically to Claire Tosoff who then prints a limited number of hard copies as well as sending it out as a parish email and posting it on our website.

The Circular has become a useful communication resource for the parish for which we give thanks to God. Our hope it that we remain relevant, engaging, informative and accessible. We thank all who have helped in any way. We also thank you for your continued support.
