**OPEN DOORS - OPEN HEARTS Bulletin Announcement - April
14/19**



Open Doors-Open Hearts Fund-Raising Campaign

As you may be aware, following an inspection by the Fire Department last fall, we were ordered to remove all door stoppers and wedges. This is making it very extremely difficult when going through the doors, especially if you are carrying items in your arms, as well as when there are many people going through the doors at a time. If the Fire Department comes and finds us using wedges of any sort to prop the doors open, fines of \$150.00 would be issued for each wedge in use. Cathedral Committee has approved the installation of Electro-magnetic door stops. These run on electricity and are connected to the fire alarm system. If the fire alarm sounds, the electricity stops to the electro-magnetic holders, they release and the door closes. The doors can also be manually closed at any time. The cost of this installation is \$8000.00. We are hoping you can see your way to making a donation (over and above your regular church donation) to this campaign. Your donation will be tax deductible and tax receipts will be issued early in 2020. Please mark your donation "Open Doors - Open Hearts". There are small brown envelopes located at the back of both the Cathedral and the Chapel if you wish to use the. To start the project we received 2 donations of \$1000 each from St. Paul's Thrift Shop and the Dean's Discretionary Fund. The attached photo is a copy of the fund raising chart which will be updated weekly.
