- The **emergency door release system** is now completely installed and fully functional. Many thanks to Jim Waldie and Elaine Parkes who encouraged our considerable support of this essential project. And thanks to all who contributed. Your contributions well exceeded our expectations. Thank you!
- As announced last week at the 10 a.m. service **we will continue to share communion in the traditional manner**, standing or kneeling as we feel led, but lining up along the rails. On occasion this may vary but given a wide and inconclusive range of preference expressed in the recent survey and given some logistical challenges this is the best solution for now. Thanks to all who took the time to comment. And thanks also for your patience as data collation took much longer than anticipated.
- Concerning the **Out of the Cold review process** the next step is to share reactions at an open meeting of Cathedral Committee this coming Tuesday night. This meeting will not make a decision about the future of the programme remaining on site. It is a time for comment and question. Hopefully a way will become clear in relation to the possibilities named by Deacon Michael Shapcott in what is a comprehensive document.

ESPECIALLY NOTEWORTHY:

is the inclusion of Melissa Green as one of six individuals who are being honoured this triennium with an Anglican Award of Merit, which recognizes lay people for their contributions to the Anglican Church of Canada.

Melissa Green, of the Territory of the People, has worked for the church in a number of roles, including serving as associate director (and interim executive director, during two vacancies) of the Sorrento Centre, an Anglican retreat centre in the interior of British Columbia. Green has been a member of the 2010, 2013 and 2016 General Synods, and of CoGS in each triennium since 2010. She also



represented the Anglican Church of Canada at the World Council of Churches Assembly in Busan, South Korea in 2013.

Green said she was indebted to the many people across the church who had “mentored, supported and encouraged” her.

“It is through a community of many that the opportunities to serve the church at the local, provincial and national levels opened before me,” she said. “I am so appreciative of how each experience has formed and shaped me into who I am today and who I am still becoming. I am sincerely touched to be nominated for this award and profoundly honoured to be receiving it.” (Anglican Church of Canada)
